- a member's child of any age (including an adopted child, step child or an ex-nuptial child, a child of your spouse and your child within the meaning of the Family Law Act 1975)
- a person with whom you have an interdependency relationship
- any person financially dependent on you.

There may be tax implications in nominating certain eligible dependants directly. Please consult your financial or taxation adviser. You may also nominate that your benefit be paid to your legal personal representative (i.e. the executor or administrator of your estate).
